This drive will take you out Hwy. 26 past Hillsboro and then on up across the Oregon Coast Range on a "road less travelled". The pass is a fun curvy drive. In Astoria there are a lot of things to do and see. And, you have many choices for a scenic return to the Portland area.


Total Driving Time: 3.75 - $4.75 \mathrm{hrs} . / 91$ - 228 miles (depending on your return route)
Head west on Hwy. 26 - the Sunset Highway.

## Portland to Astoria - Driving Time: 1 hr 45 mins / 91 miles

ZerO your odometer trip gauge as you pass by the North Plains Exit Exit \#57 (the mileage points for the drive to Astoria are based on this).


Continue westward on Hwy. 26. Just past Manning (at mile 12) take the Hwy 47 North exit. This is where it starts getting fun! At mile 26 you will pass through the quaint town of Vernonia. They are equally proud of their slow speed limit through town and their effective justice system.

Leaving Vernonia, you are off through some scenic areas with great curves. At Mist (mile 43) you will diverge to the left from Hwy 47 onto Hwy 202 to Astoria. (At roughly mile 61 you will pass the County Sheriff's office on your left).

Finally you will reach your first pit-stop at mile 61.8 - the Jewell Meadows Wildlife Park and elk viewpoint. It will be a left turn directly across from the brown - ELK VIEWPOINT sign.


There is a large old gray house here and the viewpoint entrance looks like a residential driveway. There is a nice parking area and restrooms! You might even be lucky enough to see some elk here.

From this point on over the mountains to mile 73 the road is twisty, but a little rough. Fun twisties make it worthwhile!

You will approach Astoria from the southeast along Youngs River. At the Hwy 101 roundabout (mile 90), you can go left into Warrenton and south on Hwy. 101, or turn right into downtown Astoria.

If you are looking for good seafood, continue into Warrenton and turn right at the first traffic light (mile 92.8). Dooger's will be on your left. (at the end of a strip mall). [GPS: Dooger's address is 103 Hwy. 101, Warrenton, OR 97146]


If you are looking a good brewery you can check out the Rogue Public House on Hwy. 30, just east of Astoria. It is out at the end of a pier in the Columbia River. [GPS: Rogue Public House address is 100 39th St. (Pier 39) Astoria, OR 97103]


If you are looking for "fine dining", look no further than Baked Alaska. Local seafood is available and the restaurant looks out over the Columbia River. [GPS: Baked Alaska address is \#1 12th St., Astoria, OR 97103]

There are many things to do and see in Astoria - the Astoria Tower, Columbia River Maritime Museum, etc.


Do a little research before you go. If you cross the Columbia River, turn left on Hwy. 101 for a mile or so to Fort Columbia State Park. This is a former military base for the Columbia River entrance and still has gun emplacements in place. The old officer quarters are available for rent.

## Astoria to Portland -

You have a number of choices for your return to Portland. You can:

1. Return the way you came. ( $1 \mathrm{hr}, 45$ minutes driving time / 91 miles)
2. Head east on Oregon Hwy. 30 (along the Columbia River back to Portland). (1 hr. 50 minutes driving time / 101 miles)
3. Cross over to the Washington side, turn right and follow Hwy. 401 to Naselle and then right on Hwy. 4 along the north bank of the Columbia back to Longview and I-5. (2 hrs, 20 minutes driving time / 123 miles)
4. Or you can head south on Hwy. 101. If heading south, at Seaside you would head east on Hwy. 26 back to Portland. If you continue on south to Tillamook, you would head east on Hwy. 6 which returns you to Hwy. 26 near North Plains. (2 hrs, 50 minutes driving time/ 137 miles)

This is merely a suggested drive. You can shorten it - lengthen it - reverse it modify it - deviate from it or just stay home and detail your car.
