## The Back Roads of Washington Drive

The Oregon S2000 Owner's Forum: HTTP://OREGON.S2KI.COM
This 2 day drive will take you on many back roads in Washington as you loop up and cross the Cascades on the most northerly crossing. This is a very scenic drive that will give you lots of great views along the way. Return to Portland will be via I-5.


Total Driving Time: 14 hrs. 45 mins. / 817 miles
Find your way to $I-205$ on the Washington side of the Columbia River. From the Portland area take $I-205$ north across the river.

## Portland to Omak - Driving Time: 7 hrs. 15 mins. / 407 miles




Zero your odometer trip gauge as you leave or pass by the I-205 / Hwy. 14 interchange (the mileage points are based on this).
Continue north on I-205 for 3.7 miles and take the Hwy 500 exit (Exit \#30A). Follow the signs to Hwy 500 EAST. Once on Hwy 500 get into the center or left lane - both become Hwy 503. The signs say "to Brush Prairie and Battle Ground".

Stay on Hwy. 503 through Brush Prairie and Battleground to Amboy (mile 27.4). At Amboy turn right / east on Hwy 503. Hwy 503 will dead-end into Hwy 503/Lewis River Road (mile 36.1). Turn right / east on Lewis River Road. Just east of Yale (mile 39.5) is Yale Park on your right.
You will want to stop here for a pit-stop (nice facilities) as the next rest stop is 1$1 / 2$ hours away! This is a day-use area, but if you tell the entrance guard you just want to use the facilities there is no charge. Yale Lake is a beautiful setting! Leaving the park, turn right / east on Lewis River Road. You will pass through

Cougar and the road becomes FS 90. The highway winds along and above Yale Lake and Swift reservoir. You will enter the Gifford Pinchot National Forest and turn left /north on FS Road 25 (mile 60). There are a lot of hills and nice winding roads - with little traffic. You will pass by the back-side of Mt. St. Helens.


At mile 85.3 you will come to the turn-off (FS Road 99) for the Windy Ridge Observation Center. Turn left / west and then right into the Wakepish Trailer Drop to use the restrooms. Return to FS Road 25. Turn left / north. Continue north to Randle. FS Road 25 becomes Washington Hwy. 131 as you approach Randle.
At Randle (mile 105.1) turn right / east on US Hwy. 12 - The White Pass Scenic Byway. Hwy. 12 follows the Cowlitz River and crosses White Pass before running by scenic Rimrock Lake.


At Yakima follow the signs to $I-82$ North (MILE 192.7). Head north on $I-82$ out of Yakima. Take Exit \#26. At the end of the off-ramp is a Shell Station (MILE 197.7). You may want to use the restrooms here.
Rather than proceeding on $I-82$, when you leave the station, cross over $I$ - 82 and turn right on Washington Hwy. 821. This will take you up some winding roads and through the Yakima River Canyon and into Ellensburg (MILE 229.8).


Hwy. 821 will become Canyon Road which will become Main Street as you enter Ellensburg. Continue through the downtown area and then turn left on University Way
which becomes West Cascade Way. At Reecer Creek Road turn right and then immediately left on Dry Creek Conn. Just past Ellensburg turn right again heading north on Hwy. 97 (MILE 233.9).

Just outside of Leavenworth follow the signs to Hwy. 2 West - turn left on Hwy. 2 (MILE 282.5) for the last few of miles into Leavenworth. If you left Vancouver at 7:00 am you should arrive in Leavenworth at about 1:30 pm (MILE 287.2). [GPS: Downtown Leavenworth address is 800 Front Street, Leavenworth, WA]


There are many fine German restaurants in Leavenworth - Christa's Café, King Leopold's, etc. And lots of touristy shops. You will want to refuel here in Leavenworth.

Leave Leavenworth the way you came in - head southeast on Hwy. 2. Once in Wenatchee follow the signs to Hwy. 97 Alternate (MILE 306.4). This will take you up the Columbia River on the west side. Just past Winesap take a tight left turn onto Hwy. 971 (MILE 330.2).


This will take you over some ridges and then will swoop down to Chelan Lake (MILE 339). Turn right and continue along Lakeshore Road into Chelan (MILE 350). Stop here to enjoy the lake, do some shopping, etc.

Continue east on Hwy. 97A / East Woodin Avenue through town. At Hwy 97, turn left / north (MILE 355.4). Continue north on Hwy. 97 along the Columbia River to Brewster and then on to Omak (MILE 407.2).


Find your motel and do a little local exploring. [GPS: Downtown Omak address is 401 Omak Ave., Omak, WA]


## Omak to Portland - Driving Time: 7 hrs. 30 mins. / 410 miles

Have your breakfast restaurant prepare you a picnic lunch for later.
Zero your odometer trip gauge as you leave Omak (the mileage points are based on this).
Leave Omak the way you came in - head south on Hwy. 97. At MILE 5.7 turn right on Hwy. 20 west. You will come to a town where you will swear is right out of the old west - Winthrop (MILE 45.6). Don't be surprised to see cattle being herded right across the highway here.


From here on you will be climbing up the eastern side of the Cascades. You will see lots of scenic forests, snow-capped peaks and sparkling lakes.


You will go over Washington Pass and Rainy Pass before heading down the Skagit River.


There are many places along Hwy. 20 to stop and enjoy that picnic lunch.
Stop off at the Diablo Dam overview to see the dam - one of 3 on the Skagit River that produce power for Seattle.


Be sure to stop at the North Cascades Visitor Center (MILE 119.7).


Continue west on Hwy. 20 to Rockport (MILE 142.9). Refuel here in Rockport. Turn left / south on Hwy. 530 south. Continue south and west on Hwy. 530 to Arlington (MILE 189.5). Turn left / south on Hazel Street / Hwy. 530 / Hwy. 9. Continue south on Hwy. 9. At MILE 219.1 take the ramp to Hwy. 522 south. At MILE 221.7 take the ramp to I-405 south. Follow I-405 to Renton.

Take Exit \#2A to Hwy. 167 South toward Kent/Auburn (mile 243.4). Continue south on Hwy 167. At North Puyallup follow the signs to Hwy. 512 South (mile 263.8). In Puyallup Hwy. 512 turns west. At Lakewood (mile 276.6) take the ramp to I-5 South.

If you didn't do the picnic lunch and are hungry by now, you might want to stop at the Mayan Restaurant at Exit \#111 just north of Olympia (mile 292.4). Turn right on Marvin Road. The restaurant will be on your right. Excellent Mexican food! [GPS: Mayan Restaurant address is 2120 Marvin Rd NE Olympia, WA]

Continue south on $I-5$ to Portland (mile 410).


Note: The route from Cougar to Randle is only reliably open from July through October. Winter snows typically create havoc with the roads and the Forest Service needs time to repair them, replace bridges, etc. It is ALWAYS a good idea to contact the Forest Service before heading up there. If this route is closed, then head up I-5 to Exit \#88. Follow the signs to Hwy. 12 east. Continue on Hwy. 12 to Randle and pick up the above schedule from there.
