

This drive will take you on a scenic drive down the Willamette Valley and then over some littletraveled twisties on the way to the coast. Then it is up to **Newport** for lunch and back to **Portland**. This drive has less than 30 miles of freeway driving!









Driving = 10% 1, 40% 2, 30% 3 and 20% 4

Scenery = 3

Total Driving Time: 5 hrs. 30 mins. / 300 miles

Portland to Newport - Driving Time: 3 hrs. / 183 miles



Find your way to *I-5* southbound.



Zero your odometer trip gauge as you pass by the Wilsonville/I-5 exit (Exit #283) (the mileage points are based on this).

Proceed south on 1-5 to the Aurora Exit #278 (Mile 5.5). Turn left / east on Ehlen Road - under the At Aurora, turn right / freeway. south on Hwy. 99E (Mile 8.5). At Woodburn, turn left / east on Hwy. 214 / Young St (Mile 16.4). Continue through Mt. Angel.

At **Silverton**, turn **right** / west on *Hwy. 213* (Mile **27.7**). Continue west on Main Street / Cascade Hwy. At **Stayton** (Mile 43.3), the highway becomes the Stayton-Scio Road.

At Scio, turn left / south on N. Main Street / Hwy. 226 (Mile 50.8). At Hwy. 20 (Mile 60.5) turn right / west. At 1-5 follow the signs to 1-5 South (Mile 66.1).

Continue south on *I-5* to **Exit #228**

(Mile 71.0). Take the exit and head west on Hwy. 34 toward Corvallis. At Corvallis, turn left / south on Hwy. 34 Bypass / Corvallis – Newport Highway (Mile 80.9). Take the ramp to Hwy. 99 W. (Mile 81.6). At Alpine Junction, turn right / west on Alpine Road (Mile 97.2).

Alpine Road will take you on some great twisties as you head up into the **Coast Range**.

At Mile 104.5 Alpine Road becomes BLM South Fork Road and then later Alsea – Deadwood Highway. Now you are in for some great twists and turns!





Stop at the **Alsea Falls Recreation Site** (Mile 111.6). Enjoy the falls and use the facilities here.



At *Hwy. 34*, turn **left** / west (Mile 121.2). At **Waldport**, turn **right** / north on *Hwy. 101* (Mile 160.7).



Enjoy your scenic drive up the **Oregon Coast**. Don't forget to stop and enjoy the views of the ocean.



At **Newport** (Mile 175.8) you will cross over the high bridge and enter the downtown area.



You can either find lunch at one of the many fine seafood restaurants or just stop by a deli and pick up some sandwiches. Just north of **Newport** at **Agate Beach** (mile 179) is the **Yaquina Head Lighthouse**:



This is at a day-use park but has terrific views and is a great place to enjoy that picnic lunch.

There are hourly tours of the lighthouse and trails down the beach.



Newport to Portland - Driving Time: 3 hrs. / 167 miles



Zero your odometer trip gauge as you leave Newport (the mileage points are based on this).

Near the center of town is *Hwy. 20 / Corvallis – Newport Highway*. Head east on *Hwy. 20* which will take you through **Toledo** and **Eddyville**. If you need a pit-stop (there's nothing else ahead) stop at the **Elmaker State Park** (mile 179).

At Wren (mile 179) turn left / north on *Hwy. 223*. Follow *Hwy. 223* through Dallas. At Rickreal (mile 179) turn left / north on *Hwy. 99W*. At mile 179 keep right onto *Hwy. 233 / Amity – Dayton Highway*. This will route you around downtown McMinnville. At mile 179 turn right / east on *Hwy. 18 / Hwy. 233* which becomes *Hwy. 99W*. In Tigard, take the ramp to *I-5 north* (mile 179).
