This 4-day drive will take you up to British Columbia and Alberta, Canada for a drive down the Icefield Highway. This is a drive National Geographic describes as a "once in a lifetime" drive. It is truly a scenic adventure as you drive down the Canadian Rockies. You'll get to see a lot of Eastern and Central Washington, too. A passport is required for this drive.


This is no small drive. Due to the distances, it is four long days with early (7:00 am) starts.


Total Driving Time: 30 hrs. 30 mins. / 1792 miles
Pack a picnic lunch and find your way to Washington Hwy. 14 eastbound. A 7:00 am departure will put you into Kelowna at about 6:30 pm.
Portland to Kelowna, BC - Driving Time: 9 hrs. 30 mins. / 512.7 miles



Zero your odometer trip gauge as you pass by the I-205/Hwy. 14 interchange (the mileage points are based on this).

Proceed east on Washington Hwy. 14 through Camas, Washougal and Stevenson. At mile 51.6 is Drano Lake on your left. It is highly recommended that you stop here for a pit-stop as there just isn't anything further on. This rest stop is a "Day-Use" fee area for fishermen. However, we have never been bothered to just stop and use the facilities.

Just before entering Bingen, you will cross the White Salmon River and turn left / north on Hwy. 141 Alternate (MILE 57.8). This winding road takes you up out of the Gorge to the top of the plain.
At B Z Corner [GPS: 1255 Highway 141, White Salmon] you will turn right on BZ-Glenwood Highway toward Glenwood (MILE 67.9). At (MILE 88.3) you will enter Glenwood and turn right on Glenwood-Goldendale Hwy.
[You will be in for some great climbing twisties on this section!]


As you approach Hwy. 142, you will turn left / east (MILE 112.6). Proceed on to Goldendale and turn left / north on Hwy. 97 (MILE 122.9). At Toppenish follow Hwy. 22 and the signs to $I$-82 North. Head north on I-82 through Yakima. Take Exit \#26. At the end of the off-ramp is a Shell Station (MILE 198.1). You may want to use the restrooms here.

Rather than proceeding on $I-82$, when you leave the station, cross over $I-82$ and turn right on Washington Hwy. 821. This will take you up some winding roads and through the Yakima River Canyon. It takes the same length of time as using the freeway, so... why not?

At Thrall turn right on Hwy. 821 to $I-82$ (MILE 222.8). Take the left ramp onto $I-82$ north (MILE 223.4). Take the ramp to $I$-90 east (MILE 226.2).

At Vantage (MILE 251.7) take Exit \#136. Turn left / north on Huntzinger Road which becomes Main Street. Turn right on Wayne Street into the Ginkgo Forest State Park. This park has picnic benches (for that lunch you packed) and looks over the Columbia River. Check out the various petrified trees. Do NOT wander off through the grass to look at petrified wood this area has rattlesnakes! There are lots of samples of petrified wood that you can view right in the parking lot. This place may be windy!


Leaving Ginkgo State Park, return to I-90 east. At Exit \#151 take the off-ramp and follow the signs to Hwy. 283 north (MILE 268.2). Stay on Hwy. 283 until you arrive at Ephrata (MILE 289.1). Stop here for fuel. There is a Chevron station on the main street. [GPS: Ephrata Chevron address is 203 Basin St NW, Ephrata, WA]
Continue northeast on Hwy. 283 to $1^{\text {st }}$ Avenue N.W. (MILE 289.3). Turn left / north on $1^{\text {st }}$ Ave. N.W. - which becomes Baird Springs Road which becomes Sagebrush Flats Road which becomes Coulee Meadows Road. At Hwy. 2, turn left (MILE 313.3). At MILE 320. turn right on Hwy. 172 north. At MILE 338.8 turn left on Road B N.E which becomes Bridgeport Hill Road. At MILE 350.1 turn left on Hwy. 17 north. At Bridgeport you will cross the Columbia River. Turn right onto Hwy. 97 north (MILE 512.7).


Continue through Omak, Riverside and Cordell. Have that passport ready - at MILE 432.8 you will enter into Canada. Continue north on Hwy. 97 through Penticton, Summerland and Peachland. At MILE 512.7 you will enter Kelowna. Find your motel and get dinner.

## Kelowna, BC to Jasper, $A B$ - Driving Time: 6 hrs. 15 mins. / 381.2 miles



(sur)Zero your odometer trip gauge as you leave Kelowna (the mileage points are based on this).
Have your breakfast restaurant prepare you a picnic lunch for later. Continue east / north on Hwy. 97 through Vernon and Monte Creek. At Kamloops (MILE 114.8) turn right on Hwy. 5 north. Refuel in Kamloops. At MILE 253.1 arrive at Blue River Pine Provincial Park. Find a picnic table and enjoy that picnic lunch.
Leaving the park, continue north on Hwy. 5. At Tete Jaune Cache, turn right / east on Hwy. 16 - the Yellowhead Highway (MILE 317.2). Move your watch ahead one hour to Mountain Time as you enter Alberta.

This is where the scenery starts to impress. You will be traveling into the Canadian Rockies and some stunning geography. Stop at Mt. Robson Provincial park along the way (MILE 326.2). Continuing east on Hwy. 16, you will pass by beautiful Moose Lake and then over Yellowhead Pass before entering the Jasper National Park (MILE 366.9). The park entrance fee is CN\$9.80/day for each adult.
Continue on Hwy. 16 to Jasper (MILE 381.2). Refuel here and find your motel. You should arrive in Jasper at about $\mathbf{2 : 4 5} \mathbf{~ p m}$, so there is still plenty of time to explore. Go sit by the lake.


Or ride a cable tram to the top of Whistlers Mountain for some spectacular views of the Canadian Rockies. This is the highest tram ride in Canada.

Zero your odometer trip gauge as you leave Jasper (the mileage points are based on this).

Leaving Jasper, head west on Hwy. 16 - the way you came in. At MILE 1.1 turn left / south on Hwy. 93 - Promenade des Glaciers Highway.
Today you are in for an adventure. You will travel down the Icefield Highway - in a valley with towering mountains on either side. Be sure to stop at the many scenic viewing areas.


67 miles from Jasper you will come to the Columbia Icefields Visitor Centre. Here you will stop and get a nice warm cup of hot chocolate as you buy tickets to ride a sno-cat bus up onto the Athabasca Glacier. You will be able to get out and walk around (yes it can be slick).


Continuing south on Hwy. 93 you will encounter many scenic views. This is Peyto Lake:


At the town of Lake Louise, turn right / west on Lake Louise Drive (MILE 144.7). Continue to Lake Louise and find a place to park (MILE 147.8). Here you will enjoy one of the most beautiful lakes in the world.


Stop into the grand hotel facing the lake to enjoy lunch and the view. On the way back to Hwy. 93, stop off at Moraine Lake. It is near Lake Louise, but is not to be outdone. It is a beautiful turquoise lake with 7 magnificent peaks surrounding it:


Leaving Lake Louise, at MILE 149.7 turn right on Moraine Lake Road. Arrive at Moraine Lake and enjoy the view (MILE 157.2). Return to Lake Louise Drive and turn right. Arrive at the town of Lake Louise (MILE 166). Turn right / south on Hwy. 93. You will be following the Bow River all the way to Banff. Keep your eyes peeled for bear along here. Hwy. 93 becomes Hwy. 1 at Castle Junction. Continue south on Hwy. 1. Arrive at Banff (MILE 201.3).


At Banff, you can wander through the many shops, or admire the grand Banff Springs Hotel: (don't ask....you can't afford to stay there!)


The hotel is perched on edge of the beautiful Bow Falls:


Leaving Banff, head north on Hwy. 1 - the way you came in. At Castle Junction take the ramp to Hwy. 1A / Hwy. 93 west (MILE 202.4). At MILE 226.8 you will leave Banff National Park.
There will be no shortage of scenic views as you pass through the Kootenay National Park. At Radium Hot Springs, turn left / south on Hwy. 93 / Hwy 95 (MILE 285.5). At Lake Windermere (MILE 293.8), turn right to Invermere (MILE 295.6 and find your motel. You should arrive in Invermere at about 6:15 pm depending on your stops throughout the day. Refuel here.

Invermere, BC to Portland - Driving Time: 8 hrs. 30 mins./ 618 miles


Zero your odometer trip gauge as you leave Invermere (the mileage points are based on this).
Retrace your steps back to Lake Windermere and Hwy. 93 / Hwy. 95 (MILE 2.9). Turn right / south on Hwy. 93 . At Fort Steele, turn right / south on Hwy. 3 / Hwy. 95 south (MILE 72.6).

Continue on Hwy. 3 / Hwy. 95 through Cranbrook, Moyie and Yahk. At MILE 132.8 you will enter the US. Move your watch back 1 hour as you enter Idaho and return to Pacific Time. Continue south on Hwy. 95 through Bonners Ferry and Sandpoint. At Coeur d' Alene (MILE 240.1) take the ramp onto $I-90$ west. At Spokane you will want to refuel - and to stop for lunch (MILE 271).
Continue west on I-90. At Ritzville (MILE 330.3) take the left ramp to Hwy. 395 south. At Pasco (MILE 404) bear right for the exit to I-182 west. Take Exit \#12A to Hwy. 395 South (mile 405.9). After crossing the river take the left ramp to I-82 / Hwy. 395 South (mile 414.1).

At Exit \#131 (mile 432.9) take the ramp to Hwy. 14 west. Continue on Hwy. 14 to the intersection with Hwy. 97 (mile 512.5). Take Hwy. 97 south and cross the Columbia River to Biggs Junction. You may want to refuel at Biggs Junction. Continue west on I-84 to Portland (mile 610).
