
Speedometer Shops: The Place to Transfer Odometer Mileage

Need to transfer the mileage from an old odometer to a new one? Are you trying to rewrite the ODO data to a new gauge control module but it won't communicate with the HDS and you know the original mileage? In either case, if your answer is **YES**, you'll need the services of a speedometer shop that's qualified to change odometer readings. If there are no shops in your area that can do the work for a fair price, here's one we recommend:

If you decide to go with them, you'll be asked to send in the replacement part along with the known original mileage. They'll enter that mileage and return the part to you.

Make sure you check with your state Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) for any disclosure requirements. You might need to apply a Mileage Disclosure sticker or provide a True Mileage Is Unknown (TMU) notification. If your DMV isn't specific about this, refer to your dealership's Operations Manual for guidance.
